- [Help, and hope: Could cannabis possibly help fight cancer?](#) "There is data to suggest cannabis can kill cancer cells in the lab," said Cindy O'Bryant, professor at CU Skaggs School of Pharmacy who was interviewed for a piece that appeared in the Denver Post on July 13.
- [Special Report: The Last Hope](#), ABC KRGV 5 Rio Grand Valley, July 13. The station interviewed faculty member Jacci Bainbridge about families seeking assistance with their daughter's seizures. Bainbridge said "it's important for all patients using medical marijuana to involve their doctors as it's important that patients are monitored in terms of their organ function, drug-drug interaction, really important to have that medical supervision."
