- **Rob Valuck** appeared on [Fox 31](#) regarding a radical approach to the opioid overdose epidemic -- providing a safe place for drug users.
- **Laura Borgelt**, together with colleagues from CU School of Medicine and Public Health, worked on a study about access to the morning after pill. The study, led by School of Medicine student Mimi Chau, discovered that emergency contraception was not as accessible as it should be in Colorado and that serious and costly barriers remain. Published in *Women's Health Issues* journal,

the article was selected by the editors as an Editor's Choice article for their September/October edition. Borgelt and co-mentor Carol Stamm, MD, appeared in the [Denver Post](#), KOA, Colorado Public Radio and KUNC, and Time Inc's Health.com digital outlet.
